

SENATE SUMMARY MEETING OF JANUARY 8, 2018

1. Report of the Chair

The Chair reported that Mathematician Caroline Colijn, from London's Imperial College, will join SFU this year as a *Canada 150 Research Chair*. Professor Colijn will hold the Chair in Mathematics for *Infection, Evolution and Public Health*.

The Chair reported on recent research awards and honours:

- Robert Hogg, Health Sciences, has been appointed to the *Order of Canada* for his advancements in HIV/AIDS research, notably his contributions to understanding the impact of socio-demographic factors on marginalized populations living with HIV/AIDS.
- Doug Stead, who holds the *Forest Renewal BC Chair* in Earth Sciences, received the 2017 *R.F. Legget Medal* from the *Canadian Geotechnical Society*. This is the Society's most senior and prestigious award, given in recognition of Professor Stead's lifelong contribution to the field.
- Gerhard Gries, who holds the *NSERC-Industrial Research Chair* in *Multimodal Animal Communication Ecology* in Biological Sciences, has received the 2017 Gold Medal from the *Entomological Society of Canada* for his outstanding contributions to the field.
- Paul Garfinkel of History has received the *Helen and Howard R. Marraro Prize* from the *American Historical Association* for his book *Criminal Law in Liberal and Fascist Italy*.
- David Chariandy, Department of English, has received a \$50,000 Rogers Fiction Prize from the Writer's Trust of Canada for his second novel Brother. Brother also made the Giller Prize long list.

The Chair reported on recent SFU Innovates updates:

- The Industry Engagement Office filed 17 patents in the months of November and December, covering a range of disciplines from Mechatronics to Chemistry.
- For the third consecutive year, SFU will be an Innovation Partner for the *BCTECH Summit*, which will be held in May. The *SFU Innovates* display will also include a component on *KEY*, SFU's Big Data Initiative.
- *KEY* successfully concluded the Fall 2017 *Data Visionaries Series*, a series that critically examined the possibilities and impact of data on our future. It featured 12 speakers, and engaged over 550 attendees at across all three campuses. There will be a Spring 2018 series with a new set of speakers addressing the power and potential of Big Data.

The Chair reported that SFU was successful in its bid to host the Asia-Pacific Association for International Education 2020 conference in Vancouver. This marks the first time the conference will be held outside of Asia.

The Chair reported on a number of upcoming events:

- The first *President's Faculty Lecture* of 2018 will be delivered at Harbour Centre on Wednesday, January 31st by Professor Yuezhi Zhao of Communications. The topic of her lecture is *China's Belt and Road Initiative: A Critical Communication Perspective*.
- The *Jack Blaney Award for Dialogue* will be presented at the Morris J Wosk Centre for Dialogue on Tuesday, February 20th to Alice Nderitu in recognition of her international leadership in the use of dialogue to advance peacebuilding and human rights.
- The SFU *Public Square Community Summit* will be offered late in February/early March around the subject The Future of Work.
