Motion:

That SGSC approve the revisions to GGR 1.11.3 (Postponement of Publication), effective **Spring 2021**.

Summary of Revisions and Rationale:

Clarification that postponement of publication may be requested if there is an immediate risk to researcher or collaborators and need for protection of intellectual property. By replacing "commercial publication is anticipated" with "publication pending in restrictive venues", we are specifying that not all publishing venues require thesis publication in the University library to be postponed. These language changes help to clarify the existing policy and practice.
