At its meeting of March 23, 2020, the First Nations Languages Program reviewed and discussed the changing of its name to Indigenous Languages Program. The following motion was unanimously approved and carried:

"that the First Nations Languages Program (FNLP) be renamed to Indigenous Languages Program (INLP), and that names of our academic credentials and course designations be standardized to reflect this change."

The change to Indigenous Languages Program was put forth in order to streamline and synchronize the name of the Languages Program with the recent name change of the former Department of First Nations Studies to Department of Indigenous Studies. For the same reasons as the Department of Indigenous Studies, the FNLP directors view the term Indigenous to be more inclusive, and in addition better reflecting the term used by Indigenous people(s) themselves and society at large.

The academic credential titles where 'Indigenous Language" will replace "First Nations Language" include the undergraduate Certificate and Diploma in First Nations Language Proficiency and the Graduate Certificate and MA of the Linguistics of a First Nations Language as well as course code updates (from FNLG to INLG).

### Rationale for change:

The First Nations Languages Program approved a motion "that the First Nations Languages Program (FNLP) be renamed to Indigenous Languages Program (INLP), and that names of our academic credentials and course designations be standardized to reflect this change."

The change to Indigenous Languages Program was put forth in order to streamline and synchronize the name of the Languages Program with the recent name change of the former Department of First Nations Studies to Department of Indigenous Studies. Like our colleagues in the Department of Indigenous Studies and for the same reasons as theirs, the FNLP directors view the term Indigenous to be more inclusive, and in addition better reflecting the term used by Indigenous people(s) themselves and society at large.

### First Nations Indigenous Language Proficiency

**CERTIFICATE** 

This program is for students who wish to acquire conversational and literacy skills in a particular First Nations Indigenous language, to teach this language in schools, or to enhance their language for cultural reasons or professional objectives.

The certificate can be completed on a full or part time basis.

Advanced placement through course challenge to a maximum of nine units is possible for fluent speakers. Credit may be applied to a specific language and is achieved by examination from an instructor in that language with the approval of the department.

Advising for this certificate is provided by the First Nations Indigenous Languages Program (FNLP-INLP). Students should plan their program in consultation with the FNLP INLP Advisor (fnlp@sfu.ca). Each cohort must also consult with their respective language cohort's FNLP INLP Associate Director (fnlp@sfu.ca) on course electives planning.

#### **Program Requirements**

The certificate consists of 27 units. At least 12 must be earned by completing courses in the First Nations Indigenous language itself.

# **Indigenous** First Nations Language Proficiency Diploma

**DINLP DENLP** Diploma (Short)

The Diploma in **Indigenous** First Nations Language Proficiency consists of 30 upper division units to achieve at least an intermediate oral proficiency and minimum 2.0 GPA.

**DINLP** DFNLP Diploma (Full)

This program is for students who wish to acquire high intermediate to advanced oral proficiency in a particular **Indigenous** First Nations language, to revitalize their languages in their communities by contributing to restore intergenerational transmission through institutional and family-oriented use of the language, to teach this language in schools or to adult learners, and to develop resources for **Indigenous** First Nations Language learners at all levels.

The diploma can be completed on a full or part-time basis.

The prerequisite for this Diploma is normally prior completion of the SFU 27-unit undergraduate certificate in **Indigenous** First Nations Language Proficiency (**CINLP** CFNLP). Students who have completed a Certificate equivalent to the SFU **CINLP** CFNLP at other postsecondary institutions, or who undergo a Prior Learning Assessment and demonstrate skills in the language equivalent to at least low intermediate language proficiency according to ACTFL (the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages) and CEFR (the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages) or similar benchmarks, may also be admitted into the DFNLP. Advanced placement in the **DINLP** DFNLP may be obtained through course challenge, provided the applicant undergoes assessment equivalent to what is required of regular students (including a Language Proficiency Assessment, where required). Subject to a Letter of Permission from SFU, and subject to not having used transfer credit towards a credential at another university, students may apply to use up to 9 units of transfer credit from other institutions.\* Credit may be applied to a specific language and is achieved by examination from an instructor in that language with the approval of the Program.

Advising for this diploma is provided by the Department of Linguistics through the Indigenous First Nations Languages Program (INLP FNLP). Students should plan their program in consultation with the Indigenous First Nations Languages Program Advisor or an Associate Director (fnlp@sfu.ca). Each cohort must also consult with their respective language cohort's INLP FNLP Associate Director (fnlp@sfu.ca) on course electives planning.

\*Courses that students may be able to transfer could include LING 360, LING 408 and LING 430, all of which have similar courses at UBC and UVIC.



#### **Program Requirements**

The DINLP DFNLP consists of 30 units\*. At least 15 units must be earned by completing core upper level courses in the **Indigenous** First Nations language itself.

\*\* The first six focus on a single language, and the remaining courses may focus on a different **Indigenous** language (LING 408) or on more than one languages (LING 360 and LING 430).

Students must maintain a minimum grade point average of 2.0 calculated on all courses applied to the diploma that are completed at Simon Fraser University.
