

SENATE SUMMARY MEETING OF DECEMBER 7, 2020

1. Report of the Chair

The Chair, on behalf of Senate, welcomed the following new members:

- Dr. Tamara Vrooman, who has been recently installed as SFU's 12th Chancellor.
- Dr. Catherine Deverne, who became SFU's new Vice-President, Academic and Provost on November 23rd.
- Dr. Carman Neustaedter, who began his tenure as the Dean of the Faculty of Communication, Art, and Technology on December 1st.
- Kathryn Verkerk, who has been recently appointed as University Registrar and, as such, is now Senate Secretary.

The Chair acknowledged that December 6th was National Day of Remembrance and Action on Violence Against Women, the day in which 14 young women were killed in 1989 at École Polytechnique. This date takes place during the 10 days of action against gender-based violence and reminds us to reaffirm our commitment to fight hatred and violence.

Noting a recent statement to the SFU community about equity, diversity, and inclusion, the Chair reported that a new senior leadership level position will be established, and after a process of consultation with the senior leadership, will be moving to support decolonization, indigenization, and reconciliation. The Chair added that she, in her role as President, has had a number of conversations with equity-deserving groups across the University about the burden that many are experiencing in terms of trying to move forward with change at our institution.

The Chair reported that on November 23rd she, along with Board of Governors Chair Chris Lewis, hosted a conversation with the SFU Indigenous community and had the opportunity to listen to what our Indigenous students, staff, and faculty are experiencing.

In terms of the student experience and efforts to improve the learning experience for our students, the Chair reported that the start of Spring classes has been pushed back to January 11th to give faculty additional time to prepare and students extra time to reconnect with their family and friends before starting the new school term. The University continues to look for ways to enhance remote learning, support first-year students and instructors, and look for ways to streamline academic requirements so that students can progress through programs more easily.

The Chair reported that SFU researchers are continuing to advance COVID-19-related research, from diagnostics to treatment. More than \$1 million has been awarded to SFU by the Canada Foundation for Innovation through its exceptional opportunities fund. That funding was announced on November 6th by Prime Minister Justin Trudeau, and is part of an almost \$28 million research equipment fund that is supporting COVID-19-related research.
