3. 2019 Study Abroad Program Statistics – Overall Summary (Appendix A)

Enclosed is the 2018/19 Study Abroad Programs report for programs administered by International Services for Students (ISS). The reporting period is aligned with the Fiscal Year, which also coincides with the exchange program year (Summer, Fall, Spring). This reporting period allows for accurate reporting of activity, since students whose programs span 2 Calendar Years are reported within the single Fiscal Year. Because the Fiscal Year coincides with the exchange program year and recruitment cycle, the statistics also reflect strategic partnership and business process changes implemented year to year.

Reports A and B provide an overview of activity through the Formal Exchange Program, plus activity through special inbound programs and outbound study abroad programs that operate outside of an exchange mechanism. Outbound exchange activity was slightly higher than inbound exchange activity both for term count and unique student count, as the result of continuing efforts to correct historical imbalances.

Report C provides an overview of the Field Schools that operated in 2018/19. Field school activity remained similar to 2017/18, which had seen a large increase from 2016. There was same number of field school programs as in 2017/18, and an increase of 6% in the number of students participating.

Report D shows total study abroad program activity by country, including a 2-year comparison of 2017/18 to 2018/19.

The top 5 exchange destinations for SFU students in 2018/19 were:

1. France
2. Hong Kong
3. Netherlands
4. England
5. South Korea

The locations with whom SFU had the most overall student activity (outbound, field schools and inbound) were:

1. France
2. Italy
3. Hong Kong
4. Netherlands
5. England

Reports E shows outbound student activity by faculty. The faculties sending the highest number of students on study abroad programs are the Beedie School of Business (134) and the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences (127).

Report F shows outbound student activity by department/units. The departments/units sending the highest number of students on study abroad programs are Business Administration (135), Political Science (36) and Communication (32). Students who are declared in multiple programs would be reported under each department/unit.

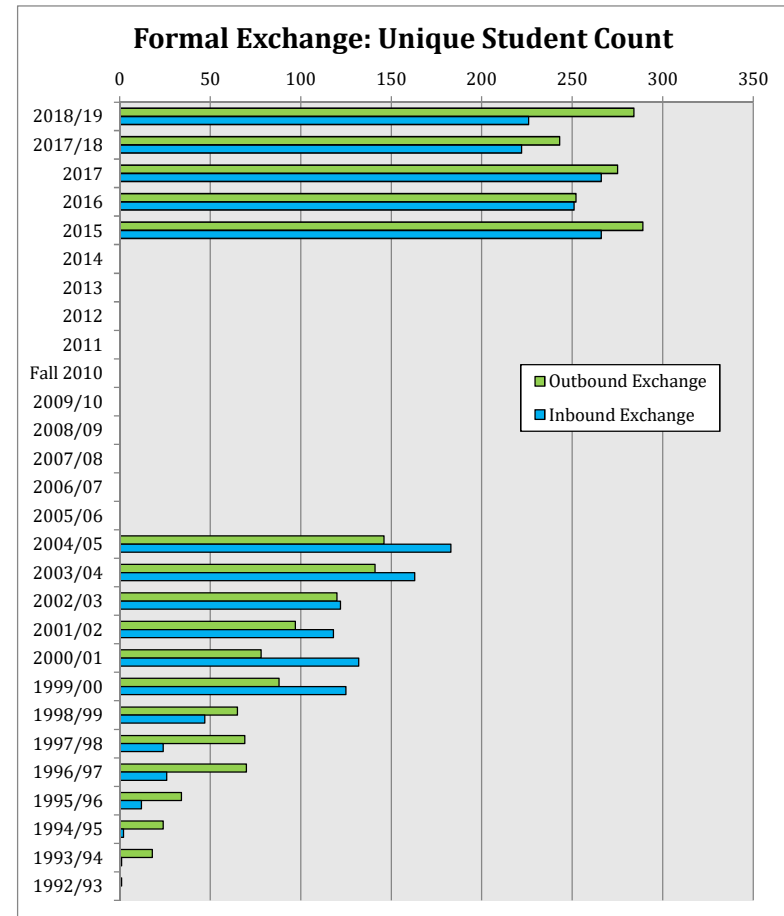
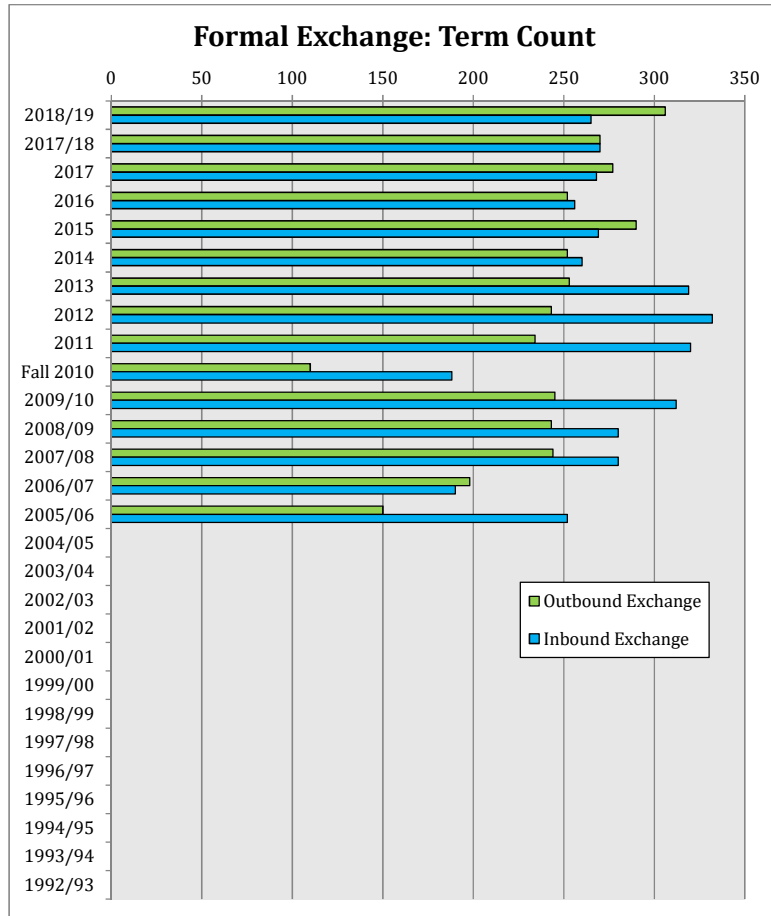
