### 3. 2020 Study Abroad Program Statistics – Overall Summary (Appendix A)

Enclosed is the 2019/20 Study Abroad Programs report for programs administered by International Services for Students (ISS).

#### **Impact of COVID-19**

The COVID-19 pandemic began during Spring 2020 and had an immediate impact on Spring 2020 study abroad programs:

SFU supported the safe return of students to their home countries (123 outbound exchange students and 136 inbound exchange students), and worked with students and partners to facilitate academic continuation for the Spring 2020 term where possible.

- 33 students' outbound exchange programs were cancelled during Spring 2020 due to COVID-19. These students are not included in the 2019/20 statistics, accounting for the appearance of an activity decrease from 2018/19 to 2019/20.
- 109 students were able to complete their outbound Spring 2020 exchange terms, most of whom returned home early and completed their exchanges remotely. These students are included in the 2019/20 statistics.
- SFU hosted 136 exchange students in Spring 2020, all of whom were able to complete their exchange terms with SFU remotely.

The near-global shift to remote learning created an opportunity for innovation in global education. SFU leveraged this opportunity and developed a number of virtual global learning pilots, including virtual exchange programs and field schools. The results of these will be reported in future years. Student interest in physical mobility has remained strong and demand for in-person programs is expected to resurge once fully possible.

Reports A and B provide an overview of activity through the Formal Exchange Program and other study abroad programs. The apparent decrease from 2018/19 to 2019/20 was owing to the 33 students whose Spring 2020 exchanges were cancelled due to COVID-19, and to the cancellation of Spring 2020 exchanges to Hong Kong following the Fall 2019 protests.

SFU's most active exchange partnerships in 2019/20 were:

1. National University of Singapore, Singapore (sent 13, received 12)
2. Université de Tours, France (sent 10, received 14); & Chinese University of Hong Kong, Hong Kong (sent 10, received 14)
3. Vienna University of Economics and Business Administration, Austria (sent 8, received 8); & Prague University of Economics and Business, Czech Republic (sent 8, received 8).

Report C provides an overview of the Field Schools that operated in 2019. Seven programs returned for Summer 2019, maintaining the same high level of program offerings and student activity for a third year.

Report D shows total study abroad program activity by country. The top 5 exchange destinations for SFU students in 2019/20 were:

1. South Korea
2. France and Singapore (tie)
3. Hong Kong
4. Netherlands
5. England

SFU students tend to study in more diverse and “non-traditional” locations (defined by Universities Canada as locations as other than the US, UK, Australia and France).

Reports E and F show outbound student activity by faculty and academic unit, respectively. The faculties sending the highest number of students on study abroad programs are the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences (125) and the Beedie School of Business (119).

The academic units/departments sending the highest number of students on study abroad programs are Business Administration, Communication, Political Science, Psychology, and French.

Outbound Study Abroad refers to SFU who students who attend a partner institution for 1 to 3 terms under the terms of a formal agreement with another institution. Students pay tuition fees directly to their host institution.

\* Years 1992/93 - 2009/10 were reported by Academic Year (Fall, Spring, Summer). The Fall 2010 term was reported separately. Years 2011 to 2017 were reported by Calendar Year (Spring, Summer, Fall). Years 2017/18 to present were reported by Fiscal Year (Summer, Fall, Spring) which coincides with the Exchange Program Year. As a result, the Summer 2017 and Fall 2017 terms are reported in both the 2017 Calendar Year stats and the 2017/18 Fiscal Year stats.

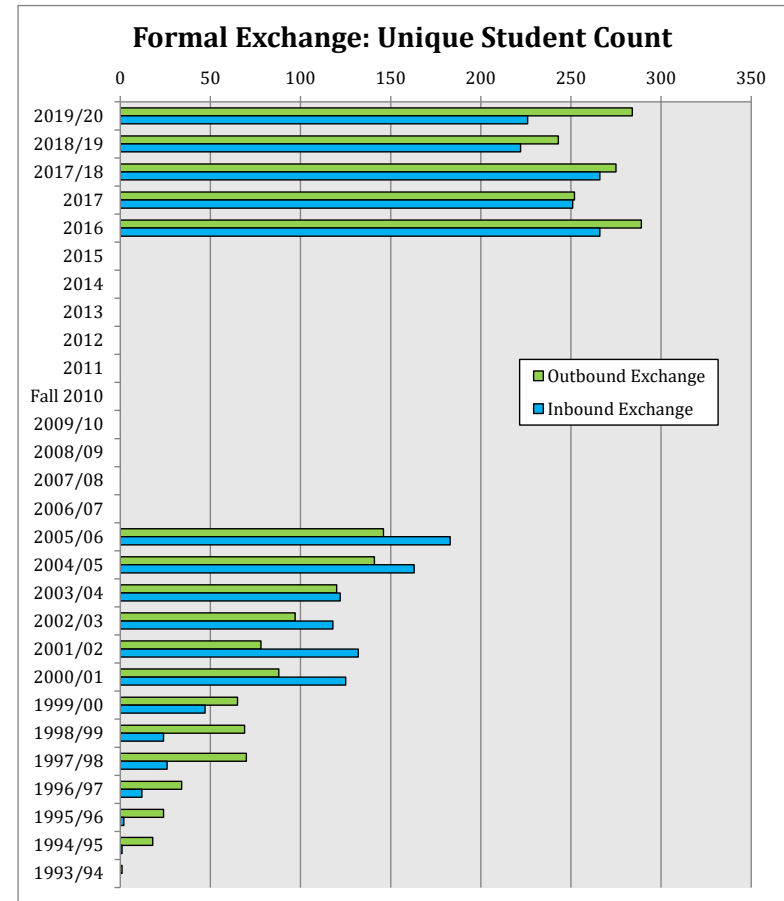
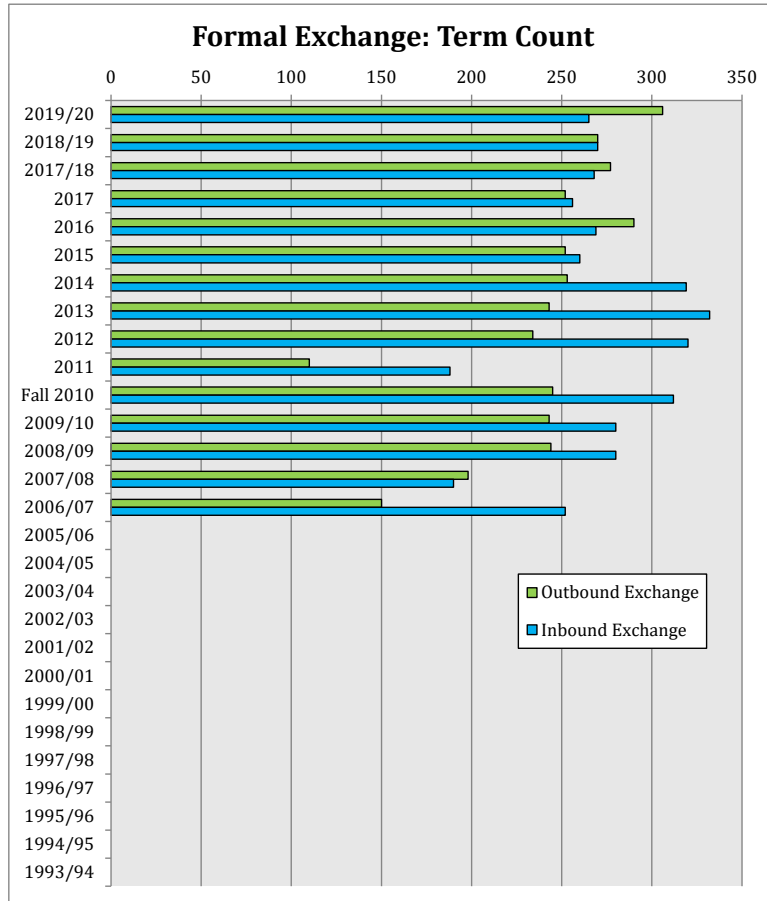
In past years, annual numbers were reported in terms of either term counts or unique student counts, as represented above. Beginning in the 2015 calendar year, numbers are reported in both ways.
