## Readmission Appeals:

Personal hearings for readmission appeals were again suspended in 1990, because of the volume of appeals. The Senate Appeals Board was again gratified to see that most readmitted students (formerty RTW or PW) performed well at SFU in their tirst semester following readmission, indicating that the criteria being used for readmission were effective. These criteria are: "The Senate Appeals Board generally expects that students who wish to be readmitted will have completed one or two semesters of further transferable coursework (12 or more semester hours) at another institution in order to demonstrate that their academic performance has improved. A GPA of approximately 3.0 will be expected if the student has a further 12-15 semester hours of coursework; a GPA of approximately 2.5 will be expected from students who have completed a further 18-30 semester hours of credit. These averages are estimates only and are subject to change without notice." These criteria are published in "A Guide to Academic Standing and Continuance," which is distributed to every student who is placed on 'Academic Probation' or who is withdrawn for academic reasons. At one readmission appeal meeting, the Director of the Academic Advice Centre was invited to attend as an observer, and this proved helpful in providing feedback to the Academic Advice Centre's Special Advisers on the nature of decision making in the SAB and the criteria used.

## Forms

The Board discussed revised appeal forms both among themselves and with the Director of the Academic Advice Centre. In 1990, significant revisions were not achieved, although agreement was reached to delete a contentious question on the readmission appeal form, namely, "Do you give authorization for a Special Adviser in the Academic Advice Centre to have access to the information included in this appeal? "

The University benefits greatly from the efforts of the SAB and the voluntary contributions of its members deserve appreciation from students, facully and administration.
