The Curriculum Committee of the Gerontology Diploma Program has approved the following change in pre-requisite for GERO 410-3 (Special Topics in Gerontology):

FROM: GERO 300

60 semester hours credit. GERO 300 recommended. T0:

Rationale: It is considered desirable that the prerequisites for GERO 410 be the same as for GERO 401. Both courses are optional courses within the Program; it is considered desirable that students taking GERO 410 should have completed at least 60 semester hours credit; completion of GERO 300, although desirable, is not strictly necessary as preparation for GERO 410.

REVISED CALÈNDAR ENTRY:

GERO 410-3 Special Topics in Gerontology

The treatment of selected psychological, sociological, economic, biological and practical aspects of the aging of individuals and populations. (Lecture/seminar) Prerequisite: 60 semester hours credit. GERO 300 recommended.
