

COURSE OUTLINE

Course Description

This course will examine current politics in several Third World nations and discuss various predictions about probable future developments in their political systems. Countries studied will include Mexico, Nigeria and Syria; topics covered will include political parties, military regimes and revolutionary movements.

Organization

A mid-term exam and final exam, as well as a short (15 page) paper.
