Requirements for a Major in History

Students must obtain at least 18 hours credit in 100 and 200 division coursework in History, including at least 6 hours in 100 division work, if they intend to enter the Major Program.

Students should plan their lower division work with the Department's upper division requirements in mind. An examination of the Department's program will show that it offers a wide range of courses organized into three principal groups. Major students will have ample opportunity to specialize in courses in any one of these groups, but, in the interest of breadth of understanding, they are required to take at least two 300 or 400 division courses from each group. A careful selection of lower division courses will prepare students to meet this requirement and lay the foundation for specialization in specific areas. For this reason, students are advised to take at least one course from each of the following groups of lower division courses:

Group 1 Europe - 105, 106, 216, 219, 220, 223, 224, 225, 226, 227, 228, 229

Group 2 North America - 101, 102, 104, 201, 212, 213

Group 3 Latin America, Asia, Africa - 146, 151, 208, 209, 230, 231, 249, 251

Major students must obtain credit in at least 30 hours of 300 and 400 division work in History, including at least 9 hours in 300 division work and at least 9 hours in 400 division work; and they must select at least two courses from each of the following groups of courses:

Group 1 Europe - 310, 311, 312, 313, 315, 316, 330, 335, 382, 403, 404, 405, 406, 408, 409, 414, 416, 417, 418, 419, 420, 480

Group 2 North America - 322, 324, 380, 385, 423, 424, 428, 429, 430, 431, 432,

Group 3 Latin America, Asia, Africa — 324, 344, 346, 350, 352, 354, 458, 459, 465, 467, 475, 478, 481

Students should consult one of the Department's Advisors before beginning their program.

Requirements for a Minor in History

Students intending to enter the Minor Program must obtain at least 9 hours at least 9 hours at least 9 hours at least 9 hours.

Minor students are required to obtain credit in 300 and in 400 division work. totalling at least 15 hours.

Requirements for Honors in History

A student intending to enter the History Honors Program shall make application to the Department's Undergraduate Studies Committee, ordinarily at the end of the fourth level.

An Honors student must meet the basic requirement for History Majors. In addition, Honors students will take HIST 495, 496, 497 and 498. Normally, HIST and 496 will be taken in the fifth and sixth levels.

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Students should plan their lower division work with the Department's upper division requirements in mind. An examination of the Department's program will show that it offers a wide range of courses organized into three principal groups. Major students will have ample opportunity to specialize in courses in any one of these groups, but, in the interest of breadth of understanding, they are required to take at least two 300 or 400 division courses from each group. A careful selection of lower division courses will prepare students to meet this requirement and lay the foundation for specialization in specific areas. For this reason, students are advised to take at least one course from each of the following groups of lower division courses:

Group 1 Europe - 105, 106, 216, 219, 220, 223, 224, 225, 226, 227, 228, 229

Group 2 North America - 101, 102, 104, 201, 212, 213

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Candidates for Honors or a Major in History may count either or both of W.S. 201-3 and W.S. 202-3 towards the 18 lower division History credits they are required to take.

RATIONALE:

The department feels that the change of description for W.S. 201 and W.S. 202 justifies the inclusion of these courses, when necessary, with the 18 hours of lower division History requirements for its Honors and Majors.
