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## FRENCH FOR THE CLASSROOM

## COURSE OUTLINE

This course will stress the contents inherent to any course in French as a second language. It will aim at giving the French teacher a mastery of the fundamentals necessary to be knowledgeable about the French language and culture, and at enabling her or him to transfer this knowledge to what will be taught in the classroom.

The major components will focus on French vocabulary, sounds, structures and cultural aspects with emphasis on the distinct characteristics of written and spoken usage, and with a view to possible implications for listening, speaking, reading, writing and communicative skills as well as for the setting-up of exercises. The perspective of the course will essentially be that of French for pedagogic purposes.

## GOALS

This course should enable the participants to familiarize themselves with the problems linked to the phonological, lexical, grammatical and cultural aspects of a course in French as a second language.
