TO: "Economic History of Canada"

"Analysis of leading issues in Canadian Economic History. The Historical experience of other areas will be examined when useful contrasts can be made."

RATIONALE:

To conform to content of course as it is actually taught.

p. 116 COMM 373-5 Change of Title & Description

FROM: "Production Management"

"Factory location and layout; product design; production methods; materials handling, control of output, quality, cost, inventories, and production flow; time and motion study and methods of work analysis."

TO: "Operations Management"

"The management of operating systems including: allocation and scheduling of resources; control of costs, inventories, quality, and manpower; design of operating systems including location, layout and manpower; establishment of work methods and standards."

RATIONALE:

While it may seem that the change is cosmetic, this represents a more accurate representation of the kinds of issues we are attempting to cover in this course and would consequently send a more accurate signal out to students. The material treated in this course, particularly in B.C. environment, goes beyond a classification as strictly production issues.
