Action taken by the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Studies at its meeting on November 6, 1979 gives rise to the following motion:

## MOTION

That Senate approve and recommend approval to the Board, as set forth in S79-143, the following changes in Women's Studies:
(i) Addition of two new course nunbers to W.S. 301-3 Special lopics in Wonlen's Studies W.S. 302-3, 303-3.
(ii) Addition of one new course number to W.S. 300-5 Special Topics in Women's Studies W.S. 310-5
(iii) Course change W.S. 100-3

NOTE:
This motion represents an amendment to the proposal originally put forward by Women's Studies, i.e. that five new special topics courses be added at the 300 division. Members of SCUS also expressed the opinion that the Women's Studies Program should consider what restriction if any should be placed on the number of credits for special topics courses which could be applied toward a minor.
