RATIONALE: Experience with students who have taken COMM 221-3 and COMM 222-3 simultaneously has been unfavourable. It is logical that the concepts course precede the procedures course. Problems occur who students drop or fail COMM 221-3 and complete COMM 222-3.

RATIONALE: Experience with students who have taken  $\overline{\text{COMM}}$  320-3 and COMM 321-3 simultaneously has been unfavourable, as COMM 321-3 builds on work of COMM 320-3. There are problems when students drop or fail COMM 320-3 and complete 321-3.

# Change of Prerequisites

ADD: "COMM 270-3. 60 credit hours."

RATIONALE: Comm 387 (like Comm 371-Organization Theory, for which Comm 270 is already a prerequisite) requires a familiarity with basic behavioral concepts, research findings, and normative approaches regarding such topics as motivation, group relationships, and deciporal formulation and implementation. A common core of such information is provided by COMM 270.
