Action taken by the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Studies at its meeting of November 15, 1977 gives rise to the following motions:

MOTION 1

"That the Linguistics Honors program as outlined in paper S. 77-143 be approved and recommended to the Board for approval.

Note - there are currently fifty undergraduate students majoring in Linguistics. Many such majors undertake additional course work and could well qualify for the Honors program. Only one additional course, 490-3 (Honors Essay) is being proposed in order to accomodate such students.

Since the Linguistics Honors program is a new program Senate requires a recommendation from the Senate Committee on Academic Planning. That Committee considered the Linguistics Honors program at its meeting of November 16, 1977, and approved the following motion:

"That SCAP approves the new Linguistics Honors program and notes the committment to additional resources is not implied by this approval."

The proposed Honors program will provide students with an opportunity to specialize slightly more in a particular field of study within Linguistics and improve their eligibility for graduate school.

MOTION 2

"That the proposal to increase lower division requirements for a major or a minor in Linguistics by the addition of LING 222-3, as proposed in S. 77-143 be approved and recommended to the Board for approval.

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MOTION 3

"That the change of title and description for LING 412-3 (English as a Second Language) as set forth in S. 77-143, be approved and recommended to the Board for approval.

Note - the proposal is to change the title from "The Teaching of English as a Second Lanaguage" to "English as a Second Language" and to lessen the stress on specific methods, materials, aids, observation and practice teaching. The Department of Modern Languages proposed to increase its stress on the application of Linguistics to the teaching of English as a second language and the Faculty of Education has indicated its interest in the creation of a new course designed to focus on the implementation of teaching strategies. It is anticipated that the two courses could be offered together thereby enhancing their respective value, particularly for teachers and prospective teachers of English as a second language.

MOTION 4

"That the new course, LING 490-3 (Honors Essay), as set forth in S. 77-143, be approved and recommended to the Board for approval.

MOTION 1

"That the proposed changes in title for RUSS 340-3, (Russian Literature in Translation I) and RUSS 341-3 (Russian Literature in . Translation II), as set forth in S. 77-143, be approved and recommended to the Board for approval.

Note - these survey courses are presently taught in English and the Department of Modern Languages would prefer that fact to be clear to students from the calendar.

MOTION 2

"That the changes in course description for RUSS 301-3 (Advanced Russian-Composition I), RUSS 140-3 (Russian Civilization), RUSS 450-3 (Russian Literature from its beginning through the Eighteenth Century), RUSS 451-3 (Russian Literature of the first half of the Nineteenth Century), RUSS 452-3 (Russian Literature of the second half of the Nineteenth Century), RUSS 453-3 (Russian Literature of the Twentieth Century), RUSS 454-3 (Seminar on Individual Russian Writers), RUSS 455-3 (Studies in Twentieth Century Writers), as set forth in paper S. 77-143 be approved and recommended to the Board for approval.

Note the change in description for RUSS 301-3 and 140-3 is intended to bring the descriptions in line with what is actually covered in those courses. The changes in description for the series of courses RUSS 450-3 through 455-3 is intended to clarify the fact that these courses are conducted entirely in English for non-major and non-minor students.

Action taken by the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Studies at its meeting of November 15, 1977 gives rise to the following motions:

MOTION 1

"That the change of title and prerequisite comment for SPAN 104-8 (Intensive Introductory Spanish), as set forth in S. 77-143, be approved and recommended to the Board for approval."

Note - the purpose and description of this course remain unchanged and the title is being changed only so that it will more accurately reflect the nature of the course which is "intensive" but not "immersion".

MOTION 2

"That the change in course description for SPAN 351-3 (Introduction to Poetry), as set forth in S. 77-143 be approved and recommended to the Board for approval.

Note - this constitutes a little more than an editorial change since it is merely a deletion of a statement about the frequency of course offering.

MOTION 3

"That the proposed new courses SPAN 352-3 (Colonial and XIX Century Latin American Literature), 453-4 (Latin American Short Story), 454-4 (Latin American Theatre), as set forth in paper S. 77-143, be approved and recommended to the Board for approval.

Note - these courses are proposed in order to provide greater coverage of latin american literature within spanish literature offerings.

The Library has indicated the need to purchase additional materials for each of the three courses and has stated that the 1978/79 allocation for Modern Languages will be adequate for the incorporation of this particular need. The Librarian has indicated that eight months' lead time is required to obtain the materials and the Department of Modern Languages has identified the Fall Semester 1978 as the first semester in which any of these courses would be offered. There has been no request for a waiver of the normal two semester time lag requirement.

Finally, these courses are seen as a useful compliment to existing courses in the Latin American Studies Program.

MOTION 4

"That the proposal for the discontinuation and deletion from the calendar of SPAN 414-3 (History of the Spanish Language II) be approved and recommended to the Board for approval.

Page 160 NEW PROGRAM: LINGUISTICS HONORS PROGRAM

An Honors program in Linguistics is offered, consisting of the following courses:

<u>Lower-Division Courses</u>: LING. 130-3, 220-3, 221-3, 222-3.

Upper Division Courses: At least 50 hours of upper division courses, of which 27 hours comprise LING. 300-3, 401-3, 402-3, 403-3, 404-3, 405-3, 406-3, 407-3, 490-3*, and a minimum of 11 hours selected from other upper division courses offered by the department in General Linguistics or in French, German, Russian or Spanish Linguistics. The remaining hours may be selected from the following courses offered by other departments: PHIL 310-3, 341-3, 344-3, 444-5; PSYC 302-3, 320-3, 351-3, 365-3, 380-3, 420-5, 425-5; S.A. 327-4, 355-4, 358-4.

Students intending to take an Honors degree in Linguistics are strongly advised to combine this with a minor in a language.

Below is a selection of elective courses that would be appropriate for students wishing to take their Honors degree with emphasis on specific fields of Linguistics.

Emphasis on Field Linguistics: LING 408-3, LING 409-3, S.A. 327-4, S.A. 355-4, PSYC 320-3.

Emphasis on Theoretical Linguistics: LING 422-3, PHIL 341-3, PHIL 344-3, PHIL 444-5, either PEIL 310-3 or PSYC 380-3, PSYC 425-5.

Emphasis on Language Acquisition: LING 409-3, LING 410-3, LING 411-3, LING 412-3, PSYC 302-3, PSYC 351-3, PSYC 365-3, PSYC 420-5.

* LING 490-3 Honors Essay Topic of a specific nature to be agreed upon by the student and a particular faculty member.

Other specialties are possible, and this list is intended only as a guide.

- RATIONALE: a) At the moment there are only Minor and Major degree programs in Linguistics. Student demand for an Honors program is based on:
 - 1. A desire to have an opportunity to specialize in a particular field of study within Linguistics.
 - 2. A desire to meet the requirements of certain Canadian and foreign Graduate Schools (e.g. McGill) which require an Honors degree for entrance.
 - 3. Certain graduate scholarships are only given to students enrolled in an Honors program.
 - b) Most other departments in the University offer an Honors program.

FURTHER COMMENTS:

The proposed Honors program involves only the addition of one new course, (LING 490-3 Honors Essay)

This course

will be offered only twice a year. The fact that only one additional course is required is a clear indication that existing courses in the University already offer the student an excellent education in Linguistics. The new program only gives official recognition of this fact.

Colonial and \overline{XIX} Latin American Literature (352): only 5 of the 20 items in the bibliography are in the Library collection.

Latin American Short Story (453): lack 11 of the 28 titles cited.

Latin American Theatre (454): lack 14 of the 24 titles cited.

On the basis of the reading lists provided in the proposals the Library is not prepared to support these courses this fiscal year as the allocation for modern languages has been committed or spent. Since the acquisition of Latin American imprints takes at least two semesters, ordering could begin in December ('77) or January ('78) against the 78/9 book budget. This would mean that the earliest possible date to begin offering these courses would be the Fall of '78 unless upon further investigation and consultation with the department we can identify alternative materials already in the collection which would be acceptable.
