Action taken by the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Studies at its meeting of July 13th, 1976 gives rise to the following Motion:

#### MOTION:

That Senate approve the specification of CRIM 101-3 as a prerequisite for the upper division criminology courses identified in paper S.76-93

NOTE: During the first year of the criminology curriculum it has not been appropriate to require a lower division course as a prerequisite for upper division courses. Nevertheless, it is desirable to require students who want to take advanced criminology courses or seminars to have "the basic and fundamental notions which are dealt with in the introductory level course". The Department had stated that it would always be possible to admit exceptional students with the special permission of the Department.

The earliest feasible implementation date for this new requirement is 1 January, 1977.

The Department of Criminology is seeking approval to amend the calendar entry for a number of its upper levels courses, to reflect the addition of our introductory Criminology course CRIM 101-3 as a prerequisite for these courses.

During the first year of operation, it was impractical to put the introductory Criminology course CRIM 101-3 as a prerequisite for all upper level courses. Now that the course has been offered twice, and will be offered regularly in the future, and in line with the usual practice of most Departments on campus, the Criminology Department finds it necessary to require the students who want to take advanced upper level Criminology courses or seminars to have acquired the basic and fundamental notions which are dealt with in the introductory course. However, it will always be possible to admit exceptional students with the special permission of the Department.
