The Kinesiology additions proposed have the effect of increasing the Recommended Kinesiology options available to students wishing to qualify for a specific Minor.

The attached amendments to the calendar description for the Minor in Learning Disabilities are primarily intended to serve an informational function for students; and to document aspects of the Minor that are operationally in effect.

The general description of the Minor has been expanded to specify the actual connection between the Minor and the Professional Development Program.

A number of recommended courses have been added.

The purpose of this listing is for the guidance of students in selecting support studies for the Minor in Learning Disabilities.
