At its meeting of 5th November, the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Studies discussed the attached proposal for changes to requirements, prerequisites and courses in the Department of Modern Languages. This proposal is now forwarded to Senate for its consideration, with the Committee's recommendation that it be approved.

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MODERN LANGUAGES

p. 127 FRENCH Course Requirements Change in Requirements: From "Honors, major and minor: FREN 151 (or 100/101), 201, 202 and 230 or 240."

to "Honors, Major and Minor: FREN 151, 201, 202 and 230 or 240."

p. 128 FREN 100-3

Change in Prerequisites: From "For beginners and near beginners. May not be taken by students who have completed FREN 102-4."

To "For beginners. May not be taken by students who have completed FREN 102-4."
See Appendix A.

p. 129 FREN 151-4 Prerequisite Change: From: "For students with B.C. Grade 11 French or higher requiring an oral practice course. May not be taken by students who have completed FREN 101-3 (formerly 103-4), 100-3 (formerly 102-4) or 150-3."

To "For students with B.C. Grade 12 French or higher requiring an oral practice course. May be taken by students who have completed FREN 101-3 (formerly 103-4), 100-3 (formerly 102-4) or 150-3."

p. 129 FREN 201-3

Prerequisite Change: From "Normally FREN 151-4 or 101-3. May be taken by students with B.C. Grade 12 French who already have good oral competence."

to ""Normally FREN 151-4. May be taken by students with B.C. Grade 12 French who already have good oral competence and some grammatical background."

p. 129 FREN 205-1

Prerequisite Change: From "FREN 151 or 101 (formerly 103) or permission of the course chairman."

to "FREN 151 or permission of course chairman."

Rationale:

Since the calendar changes of 1973-74 it has become evident that students beginning French at 100-101-201 etc. are forced to drop FREN 201 because they do not have sufficient preparation. These students

should, therefore, be allowed to take FREN 100, 101, 151 before taking 201 etc.. On the other hand, since there is an ever increasing number of complete beginners, it was decided to reserve FREN 100 for complete beginners. An English speaking student coming from high school and taking French at Simon Fraser University could enter into either FREN 100 or 101 or 151 or 201 according to his competence.

No changes are needed for course challenge regulations. FREN 100-101 are being dropped from the Honors, Major and Minor Requirements as FREN 101 can no longer be taken instead of FREN 151.

The department realizes that this change will add another course to the program of many students. However, this is preferable to the present situation where some students lack the preparation for FREN 201.

p. 129 FREN 301

Prerequisite Change: From "FREN 202-3 or permission of the course chairman."

to "FREN 202-3 or permission of the course chairman. Students with limited experience in writing compositions in French are advised to take FREN 206-3 before undertaking FREN 301-3." See Appendix E. Rationale:

The department has found that some students enrolling in French 301-3 do not have adequate preparation to complete FREN 301-3 successfully. FREN 206-3 will provide background for those whose experience in writing compositions is slight.

p. 130 FREN 409-3

Change in Prerequisites: From " "FREN 405-5 highly recommended."

to "FREN 405-5 highly recommended. Should be taken during the last semester of linguistic studies."

Rationale:

This is an advanced course which should only be undertaken by students with a wide background in Linguistics.

Rationale:

To indicate to students the logical sequence in which courses should be taken.

To indicate to students the logical sequence in which courses should be taken.

To be taken in Upper Levels:

Honors: 50 units of German, 300 and 400 series (9 of which may be taken from the 400 series in the Linguistics Division).

Major: 30 units of German 300 and 400 series (3 of which may be taken from the 300 and 400 series in the Linguistics Division).

Minor: GERM 300 or 301 or 302 and at least 12 hours of 400 division courses in German.

In addition, the Honors student will be expected to acquire a proficiency (i.e. the equivalent of two semesters) in a second language other than English and the language of his honors program."

Rationale: Students may now take a major or a minor in Linguistics. The German Division wishes to insure that the majority of the courses in the major are in German rather than in Linguistics.

p. 132 GERM 100-3 Change of Course Number and Credits: From

"GERM 100-3" to "GERM 102-4."

Rationale:

Justification for request to raise credit value of German 100-level courses: At present there exists an obvious disparity between contact hours of the intensive German language program at the 100-level and the number of credits given (5 contact hours plus recommended practice time of 2 hours per week in the language lab for 3 credit units).

Two years ago, the German Division reduced the credits from 4 to 3. This was done not for language-pedagogical but for administrative reasons. It has since become clear to us that this change has created, rather than resolved, problems.

At that time, Spanish (like German) kept the same number of contact hours, but (unlike German) kept the same number of credits; whereas Russian (unlike German) reduced the number of contact hours, when (like German) they reduced the number of credits. For some reason, German got the worst of both alternatives and we wish to correct that situation.

p. 134 GERM 447-2 Change in Course Description: From "A study of main trends in the development of German drama from 1818 to 1885."

to "A study of main trends in the development of German drama."

Rationale:

The title already gives the nineteenth century for the period to be examined and we did not want to impose our restriction (1818-1885) on top of another nineteenth century.

RUSSIAN

p. 135 Honors Course Requirements Change in Course Requirements: From "RUSS 302, 401, 402, 409 or 449."

Rationale: RUSS 301 is a prerequisite to 302; therefore the change more accurately indicates requirements.

p. 135 Course Requirements Change in Requirements: From "b) Literature Concentration Russ 301, 302, 450, 451, 453."

to "b) Literature Concentration RUSS 301, 302, 450, 451 and either 452 or 453."

Rationale: To provide the student with more flexibility. Both RUSS 451 and RUSS 452 are 19th century literature courses.

Change in Course Description: From "Emphasis is placed on written command of Russian. Detailed study of advanced questions in grammar and basic analysis of literary style."
