Satisfactory Performance

Change in Requirements: From "The progress of each candidate will be assessed periodically by the Department. A course grade of less than B is not considered satisfactory at the graduate level. Any student who performs unsatisfactorily in two or more courses may be required to withdraw from the program."

To: "The progress of each candidate will be assessed periodically by the Department. A course grade of less than B is not considered satisfactory at the graduate level, with the exception that an M.A. candidate is permitted one grade of P in either of two Research Design courses (Psychology 910 or Psychology 911). Any student who obtains a grade of less than B in two or more courses may be required to withdraw from the program."

Ph.D. Program Degree Requirements

From: "The student will participate in a program of study decided upon in consultation with his initial adviser and subsequently with his Ph.D. Supervisory Committee. This program must include at least two Proseminars, which are to be taken before the end of his first three semesters in residence as a Ph.D. candidate in the Department. These two Proseminars may be chosen from any of those offered by the Department."

Satisfactory Performance

Change in Requirements: From "The progress of each candidate will be assessed periodically by the Department. A course grade of less than B is not considered satisfactory at the graduate level. <u>To:</u> "The progress of each candidate will be assessed periodically by the Department. A course grade of less than B is not considered satisfactory at the graduate level, with the exception that an M.A. candidate is permitted one grade of P in either of two Research Design courses (Psychology 910 or Psychology 911). Any student who obtains a grade of less than B in two or more courses may be required to withdraw from the program."

Ph.D. Program Degree Requirements

From: "The student will participate in a program of study decided upon in consultation with his initial adviser and subsequently with his Ph.D. Supervisory Committee. Any student who obtains a grade of less than B 12.2 or more courses may be Tequire to wroken rogram.

Rationale:

The requirements in research design are to be modified for M.A. candidates only. At the M.A. level students should have a good command (a grade of no less than B) of one area of research design (Psychology 910 or Psychology 911) to enable them to undertake analysis of research data, and in addition, should have some awareness and understanding of alternatives (a grade of no less than P in the other research design course). Experience with the existing requirements indicates some degree of over-emphasis beyond what is essential for Psychology students at the M.A. level. The change does not result in any reduction of overall standards, but reduces somewhat the special emphasis given to research design in contrast to specific content areas of Psychology. (A CGPA of 3.0 must be maintained as before.)

Rationale: At the Ph.D. level students are expected to have a good background in both areas of research design and the addition in the calendar makes this expectation explicit. The ambiguity in recent calendars occurred inadvertently when the general statement of admission requirements for Ph.D. candidates as it appeared in 1970-71 was dropped from later calendars.
