Course Requirements for Honors What was previously "Archaeology majors who wish admission to the honors program must hold and maintain at least a 3.0 cumulative grade point average. In addition, the successful completion of Mathematics 101 or a comparable statistics course, the Honors Reading and Honors Essay Archaeology courses, and ten credit hours in other approved courses over and above the requirements for a major are necessary."

<u>Replace with</u> "Archaeology majors who wish admission to the honors program must hold at least a 3.0 cumulative grade point average and to remain in the program must maintain that average. The successful completion of the Honors Reading and Honors Essay Archaeology courses, and ten credit hours in other approved courses over and above the requirements for a major are also necessary. In addition the successful completion of either Mathematics 101, or Computing 100 and 102, or Psychology 210, or a statistics course approved by the Departmental Chairman is required."

Rationale:

Both the computing courses and Psychology 210 are methodology courses of considerable use to Archaeologists. Students are advised to obtain a background in either statistics (Mathematics 101, Psychology 210) or computing (Computing 100 and 102), as both are used more and more in Archaeology.

p. 72 Arch. Prerequisite change: from "Any lower division Archaeology 372-5 course" to "Any lower division Archaeology course or permission of the Instructor."

Arch. Credit hour change: to "Arch. 373-5."

Rationale

Experience has proven that students spend more time on this course than the usual 5 credit hour course (up to 20 hours a week lab time). The department agrees that the credit hours should be changed to 5. See Appendix A.

<u>Prerequisite change</u>: from "Any lower division Archaeology course or permission of the instructor" to "Archaeology 272 and permission of the instructor".

3. JUSTIFICATION

A. What is the detailed description of the course including differentiation from lower level courses, from similar courses in the same department, and from courses in other departments in the University?

Each of the 3 lower div. archaeology courses at present offered by the Department cover a broad area in depth. Arc. 436-3, Readings in Archaeology, is usually offered in conjunction with Arc. 433 and 434 as part of the Summer Field School and requires specified readings in Archaeolog method and technques. The majority of our students register for Field School and so register for Arc. 436-3. The new course will differ from the Archaeology Department curriculum presently in effect. Students who become interested in certain aspects of Archaeology, i.e. physical anthropology, will be better prepared for post-graduate work at other institutions.

B. What is the range of topics that may be dealt with in the course?

Prehistory of the New World and Old World, Physical Anthropology (Human Osteology, Fossil Man), Primitive Man, Theory.

C. How does this course fit the goals of the department?

This course does not alter the goals of the department in any way. Students will be able to obtain a broader background in certain areas of Archaeology which they have covered in courses already taken.

D. How does this course affect degree requirements? It may be used to satisfy degree requirements, but is not specifically required by majors or honours.
