## JOTNT FACULTY REPEREMUM

Report of Interim Council of Joint Faculty and Minoxity Repot:

At its meeting of September 25 th, 1968 Jojnt Faculey approved the following:
"that the report of Interim Council of Joint Faculty be dealt with by Joint raculty in the following maner:
(a) The report of Interim Council except for Item 4 , . Paper No. 4 (pp. $\& \& 9$ ) covering Item 3 of the Joint Faculty Agenda, Soptember 25th, 1963, be distributed without dedate as recomendations for approval by Joint Faculty in an Aderatimmad referendun.
(b) That the minority Interim Councji report and the recomendations of the Student Implementation Committee be presented in the sane reforenclun as altematives to the majority report recomandations.
(c) If an Interin Comoil recomendation or its alternatives fail to reccive a clear majority, (i.e. over $50 \%$ ) in the mail referendum the iten will be put before Joint Faculiy for debate.
(d) That the referendum bo hold one week after the Student Implenentation Connittee Report has been circulated ou October 25 th, whichever is the earlier."

Note:-. As the Student Implementation Comattee Report has not been ratified, it has not been possible for the Comititee to include items from that report in the referendun. The referenciun includes items from the Interin Report of Joint Faculity and from the linority Report.

Voies are to be indicated on the attached referendum. For items A-I, A-IJ, and B-I: please read instructions carefully.

The completed referendum should be placed in the appiopriate envelopes provided in accordance with the instructions thereon and reterned to the Registrar by 2:00 P. M. Thursday, Noventer 21, 1965.
