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#### DEPARTMENT OF MODERN LANGUAGES - LINGUISTICS

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LING 410-3 Change in course title:

From: Applied Linguistics

To: Second Language Teaching: Theory

RATIONALE: It has been discovered that students have been unclear about the meaning of the term 'applied linguistics'.

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LING 410-3 Change in prerequisites

From: None. Students with credit for LING 426-5 may not take this course for further credit.

To: None. Students are advised to take LING 130 and 220 or 221 (or to consult the instructor) before attempting LING 410. Students with credit for LING 426-5 may not take this course for further credit.

RATIONALE: Experience has shown that in general it is quite desirable for a student to have had exposure to the more elementary courses before attempting more advanced courses.

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LING 411-3 Change in course title

From: Second Language Teaching

To: Second Language Teaching: Practice

RATIONALE: The department, in view of the course title change for LING 410-3, wishes to make clear the difference between that course and LING 411-3, the former being the theory while the latter is the practice.

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LING 411-3 Change in course description

From: Deals with the functional aspects of second language pedagogy as it relates specifically to teaching in B.C.

(Lecture/Laboratory)

To: Evaluation, preparation and presentation of second language teaching materials with special reference to the theory presented in LING 410 and to second language teaching in B.C.

(Lecture/Laboratory)

RATIONALE: Emphasizes the relation of this course with LING 410-3 and its practical, as opposed to theoretical nature.

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LING 412-3 Change in Prerequisites:

From: None. Students with credit for LING 429-5 may not take this course for further credit.

To: LING 130 and 221; students with experience in teaching English as an additional language may be exempted from these prerequisites with permission of the instructor. Students with credit for LING 429-5 may not take this course for further credit.

RATIONALE: Intended to ensure that students will have some acquintance with basic concepts.

RATIONALE: German 300,301 and 302 are complete courses in themselves and a student is not requested to take the <a href="entire">entire</a> series or 300 before enrolling in 301,but may take only one course if he/she choses to do so . German 202-3 or consent of the instructor is the prerequisite for all 300-level language courses in German. It is only an oversight that this rule which was followed for years, has never been clarified in the Calendar.

From: Reading in Spanish Linguistics

To: Readings in Spanish

SPAN 409-3 Change in course description

From: Guided readings to meet the individual needs and interests of hono rs students in Spanish. Required for honors students in Spanish linguistics the course may be taken by other students with the consent of the instructor.

To: Guided readings to meet the individual needs and interests of honors students in Spanish. Required for honors students

in Spanish: the course may be taken by other students with the consent of the instructor.

RATIONALE: The current Calendar makes no distinction between a major, honors program in Spanish Linguistics or Spanish Literature; the concentration is merely "Spanish". Spanish 409 as it presented appears in the Calendar specifies readings in Spanish Linguistics and thereby, as a course required for honors students in Spanish, falsely implies that there is indeed such a degree as honors in Spanish Linguistics. The proposal to delete the word linguistics from the course title and course description is intended to bring the course description into line with the reality of the degrees available.
