Subject: Regalia for
lay members of Senate

It was decided some time ago that the Board of Governors should be provided with a special gown for ceremonies on the campus. All Faculty members and those staff members who hold university degrees have gowns which are the official regalia of the University which granted them their degrees.

Senate could now decide to provide gowns identical to those for the Board of Governors for those lay members of Senate who do not have gowns from other institutions. I have discussed this matter with the Chancellor and the President and we are agreed that to keep the gowns the same for lay members of Senate and for the Board of Governors would have a number of advantages. Firstly, it would in a sense symbolize the close interaction between the Senate and the Board, and secondly, it would provide fewer complications when lay members of Senate are elected to the Board of Governors.

Recommendation: That Senate adopt the gown specified for the Board of Governors as the official gown for lay members of Senate who do not have gowns from other institutions.
