Background

Students often will request changes to their grades and/or degree standing after their degree is awarded either as a grade appeal or for extenuating circumstances. Often this is an attempt to clean up their record for purposes of employment or further education. SFU currently does not have a policy that addresses this issue. Decisions are made at the level of the dean's office and are not consistent across faculties.

Rationale

To have a university-wide policy that is clear for students and administration.

Motion:

The exceptions to this would be when there is an appeal pending that had been started prior to the awarding of the credential, or an administrative error on the part of the university."
