### **RATIONALE FOR INTRODUCTION OF THIS COURSE:**

Originally there was only one upper level Health Ethics course, HSCI 319W, crosslisted with PHIL 319. This course did not have philosophy prerequisites. FHS then introduced HSCI 320 with PHIL 120W as a prerequisite. This course is more congruent with upper-level Philosophy courses in having a philosophy pre-requisite. Thus, we are deleting PHIL 319 and introducing a new course number to be the upper-level course cross-listed with FHS. Since Philosophy already has a course numbered 320, we are using PHIL 327 as the number for this course. FHS has agreed to change HSCI 320 to HSCI 327. We are deleting PHIL 319 and creating PHIL 327 to be crosslisted with (the renumbered) HSCI 327.
