Centre for Dialogue

Change in prerequisites for DIAL: 460, 461

The DIAL courses are offered through the Centre for Dialogue, but the administrative home for these courses is the Faculty of Science. The DIAL 460 and 461 courses have not been used before, largely due to the restrictive prerequisites, but the Centre for Dialogue have had considerable interest from students in offering 460 and 461, especially from students who would like to engage in dialogue and public issues through coursework but are not able to take the full 15-credit Undergraduate Semester in Dialogue (DIAL 390, 391, 392). The Centre for Dialogue and the School of Communications (Zoe Druick chairs their Undergraduate Curriculum Committee), don't think the CMNS prerequisites are necessary, and that students with 45 credit hours would be sufficiently advanced to take either 460 or 461.

RATIONALE:

The intention of DIAL 460 has been to offer a seminar course that uses dialogue to connect public issues, and that is open to upper-level students across the university. The change in prerequisites will make the course more accessible, and increase our ability to engage students with public issues. There is no need for the CMNS prerequisites, and CMNS has no objection to the change. By retaining permission of instructor as a prerequisite, we can insure students have appropriate backgrounds.
