Dear Paul,

Please reinstate HUM 162-3 Latin II and PERS 168, which were temporarily withdrawn sometime ago.

The unexpected offer of help from CODE and Hellenic Studies has enabled us to create new, distance versions of HUM 161 and HUM 162, to help us bring the courses back. Only HUM 162 had been temporarily withdrawn.

The likewise adventitious financial support of the Centre for the Comparative Study of Muslim Cultures and Societies has helped us bring back PERS 168.

Attached are very old course descriptions. The new course description of HUM 162 is, however, much the same, except that this time we are using the distance format and we shall now be using the  $7^{th}$  edition of the Wheelock text, not the  $4^{th}$ .

Dear Paul,

Following up upon a commitment made last fall to the city's Persian community by the university President, Andrew Petter, we are panning to mount PERS 118 and 168 this year for the first time in several years. The course has the financial support of the Centre for the Comparative Study of Muslim Cultures and Societies and the Mirhady Lecture Endowment.

There was some confusion about whose course this was. It was and will be offered through the Language Training Institute, but is not part of its regular curriculum. Because of the confusion, I as Chair of the Humanities Department, with responsibility also for the LTI, am somewhat belatedly now asking for PERS 168, the second term course, to be un-mothballed asap.

By email, you have indicated that the offering of the course would have to be delayed until summer 2012. That would obviously have disastrous consequences for the success of the course enrollment. The first course, PERS 118, is already fully subscribed for September.

I am requesting that you find a way to expedite the un-mothballing process so that PERS 168 can be offered in Spring 2012.
