- The course models a range of instructional strategies, including: discussion; reflective practice; story; case studies; service-learning; technology and education; in-class exercises.
- The course offers a range of learning experience, including: discussion; reading and responding orally and in writing; research and field-work.
- This course will use the FirstClass conference system for some assignments and discussion.


