Course description:

The course will focus on teachers and counselors working with children with emotional difficulties, but the course will also be useful for teachers in general as they establish rapport and a relationship with their students. The course will cover material based on existential/humanistic, behavioural, dynamic and dynamic theories. The course will also cover some basic developmental issues of students.

Evaluation:

Evaluation will be based on a specific case analysis (30%), a personal position paper (30%), and a term paper describing the integration of counseling theories to the classroom experience (40%).
