COURSE DESCRIPTION

The course will offer a combination of lectures, seminars and offer an opportunity to apply of these theoretical lenses to case histories drawn from history and literary sources.

Evaluation will be base on student presentation (30%), brief position papers (20%), and a term assignment (50%).
