DESCRIPTION

This course deals with teaching theatre in an educational context. It will develop knowledge of theatre skills and introduce students to a variety of approaches and techniques for teaching theatre and doing theatre in schools.

OBJECTIVES

- 1. To introduce students to a variety of approaches and techniques for teaching theatre and doing theatre in the schools.
- 2. To foster an understanding of theatre as an art form.
- 3. To develop knowledge of theatre skills and theatrical conventions.
- 4. To have students engage in critical discussion regarding the educational value of theatre.

TOPICS

- 1. The educational value of theatre.
- 2. Acting (character, voice, movement).
- 3. How to direct (preparation, script interpretation, blocking, the rehearsal process).
- 4. Technical Theatre (scene design, stage lighting, props, make-up, costumes).
- 5. The role of the producer/teacher (publicity, fundraising, all the "extras").
- 6. Pedagogical issues in teaching theatre.

- 2. Scene Presentation (includes rehearsal log) 30%
- 3. Article Presentation 20%
- 4. Participation (includes leading a warm-up exercise) -10%
