DESCRIPTION

This course deals with teaching theatre in an educational context. It will develop knowledge of theatre skills and introduce students to a variety of approaches and techniques for teaching theatre and doing theatre in schools.

OBJECTIVES

- 1. To introduce students to a variety of approaches and techniques for teaching theatre and performing theatre in the schools.
- 2. To foster an understanding of theatre as an art form.
- 3. To develop knowledge of theatre skills and theatrical conventions.
- 4. To have students engage in critical discussion regarding the educational value of theatre.

CORE TOPICS

- The educational value of theatre
- Director's preparation, script interpretation, blocking, scene design, stage lighting and stage makeup in the context of theatre in schools
- Pedagogical issues in teaching theatre

OPTIONAL TOPICS

- Script selection
- Casting
- The rehearsal process
- Stage management
- Alternatives to traditional scripts for use in school contexts
- Acting for the stage (character, voice, movement)

REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Director's analysis for a scene- 40%
- 2. Director's prompt book for a scene-20%
- 3. Scene Presentation (includes rehearsal log) 30%
- 4. Participation (includes leading a warm-up exercise) 10%
