Description of Course

This course will begin January 7, 1989 and will be held at the Simon Fraser University Tele-Learning Centre on the campus of Okanagan College. The participants will meet face-to-face on Saturdays, January 7, January 21, and February 4. The course will also make extensive use of computer and audio teleconferences to mediate course activities.

The course will introduce teachers to the concepts of computer-based writing and microcomputer-based telecommunications. Participants will explore the use of writing technology to enhance composition instruction. Participants will also examine the concepts of computer telecommunications and interactive conferences. Readings and a course text will be used to examine the theoretical underpinnings and issues surrounding the use of computer-based writing technology in the classroom.
