**PREREQUISITE: EDUC 401/402**

**COURSE DESCRIPTION**

**This methods course is for secondary social studies teachers. The intent of this course is to facilitate your integration of a conceptual and practical understanding of social studies in order for you to develop engaging learning experiences for secondary students. Participants will participate individually and collectively in a variety of experiential and reflective activities.**

**COURSE GOALS**

- 1. To examine the nature, rationales, organizational strands and goals of social studies**
- 2. To create a unit based on cooperative learning, critical challenges and global education**
- 3. To explore a variety of approaches to social studies such as cooperative learning, simulation and issues approach so as to actively engage students**
- 4. To examine the B.C. social studies curriculum**
- 5. To investigate a variety of meaningful and relevant resources**
- 6. To plan and present a workshop on a strategy/approach appropriate to social studies**
- 7. To share ideas, approaches and resources**
- 8. To examine assessment strategies that will enhance student learning**

**PROPOSED ASSIGNMENTS AND EVALUATION:**
