COURSE DESCRIPTION

This methods course is for secondary social studies teachers. The intent of this course is to facilitate your integration of a conceptual and practical understanding of social studies in order for you to develop engaging learning experiences for secondary students. Participants will participate individually and collectively in a variety of experiential and reflective activities.

To examine the nature, rationales, organizational strands and goals of social studies To create a meaningful unit based on cooperative learning, critical challenges and global education

To investigate a variety of meaningful and relevant resources

- To work cooperatively in order to plan and to present a workshop on a strategy/approach appropriate to social studies
- To share ideas, approaches and resources
- To examine assessment strategies that will enhance student learning
