Philosophical Issues in Curriculum

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PREREQUISITE:

This course examines a number of philosophical questions relating to curriculum, most particularly the fundamental questions of what constitutes a good educational curriculum and how one justifies it as such. In pursuing those central questions a number of other key educational concepts are examined, including knowledge, emotions and intellect. Consideration will also be given to the arguments for and against the inclusion of a number of standard curriculum subjects.
