Range of Topics:

This is a fieldwork course which will take place on site at an Indian run school in B.C. Throughout the six weeks, students will work with band members on the production of curriculum resource materials which will be based on a series of activities such as fishing, basket making, storytelling and preparation of Indian foods. This will involve photographing, tape recording and writing about these activities and then editing, organizing and polishing what has been produced so that it can be used in the band operated school.

Special Instructions:

Students registering for this course require permission of the instructor. It is recommended that since they will be off campus for 6 weeks that 404 students concurrently register for 2-4 units of directed study in intercultural education under my direction.
