# **Drama and Education**

## **PREREQUISITE**

#### DESCRIPTION

This course deals with theory, curricula and methodologies in drama education. Topics will include selections from the following: aims of drama education; drama as methodology; role of the teacher in the drama classroom; evaluating students in drama classes; creative drama; the use of improvisation and storytelling; incorporating film and video work into drama classes; developing major projects with students such as choral dramatization, docudrama, sociodrama, anthology, and readers theatre; introducing scene work, stagecraft, and theatre history.

### **OBJECTIVES**

- 1. To introduce and acquaint students to a variety of approaches, techniques, sources and pedagogical issues related to drama teaching.
- 2. To encourage critical discussion regarding the theoretical grounding for drama education.
- 3. To invite personal narrative, reflective practice, and spontaneous creation into the collective environment of the drama classroom.

- Role Drama Project 10%
- Docudrama/Sociodrama Project or Myth Project 10%
- Written Reflections and Case Narrative Responses 15%
- Production Concept Project or Theatre History Project 25%
