This introductory course is designed to explore the potential of media in teaching. Particular attention will be given to design and preparation of media materials which are:

- a. student made,
- b. teacher made, and
- c. commercially made.

This course will also investigate effective and efficient uses of media to facilitate a productive learning environment. Media will be considered part of curriculum development.

Students will be expected to experience basic skills in many areas of media, as well as prepare a special project integrating these skills. Some reading will be required from a given bibliography.

Cost of materials used in the course will be borne by the students. Materials will be available at cost. Due to the high demand of equipment and limited time, students are encouraged to bring a 35 mm. camera (single lens reflex) for use in the course.
