

Education 463-4 "Educational Media"

Summer 1977

This introductory course is designed to explore the potential of media in teaching. Particular attention will be given to the design and preparation of a variety of non-print media materials.

This course will also investigate effective and efficient uses of media to facilitate a productive learning environment. Several examples of student-made productions will be shared. Media selection will be considered part of the systematic approach to curriculum development.

Students will be expected to experience basic production skills in graphics. The micro course on basic machine operation offered in the Learning Resources Laboratory, or its equivalent, should be completed prior to taking this course. The special project will consist of both a planned segment of a Learning Unit and a media production related to it. A variety of readings from current periodicals will also be required.

Cost of materials used in the course will be borne by the students. They will be available at cost price at the LRL.
