RECENT ADVANCES IN THE TEACHING OF ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE

Prerequisite: Education 467

Three new teaching methods which are very different from those currently in use in the public schools will be studied in this course. Students in the course will read about them, demonstrate them on videotapes they will make, and analyze their effectiveness as shown on the demonstration videotapes.

The videotapes will be team projects. Each student will write an individual paper as well to accompany the videotapes. There will be no exams.

The three innovative TESL methods are: (1) The Silent Way, (2) Counselling-Learning and (3) Suggestopedia.
