## RECENT ADVANCES IN THE TEACHING OF ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE

### **OBJECTIVES AND TOPICS**

1. Students will learn classroom-oriented techniques for assessing the language of learners of English as a second language.

- 2. Students will learn how to compare the growth patterns in syntax of ESL learners with those of native speakers of English so that they can determine if ESL learners in integrated classrooms are progressing normally for their age.
- 3. Students will learn how to select literature for children and adolescents who are learning English as a second language.
- 4. Students will learn to use a whole-person/whole language methodology for teaching ESL.

#### **ASSIGNMENTS**

- 1. Students will assess two features of the oral language of a real ESL learner. Students select a learner at the age/grade level of most interest to them. (25%)
- 2. Students create a timeline showing the normal development of syntax in children and adolescents. This is based on the required course readings. (20%)
- 3. Students will compare the language of an ESL learner (from Assignment 1) and a native speaker of English of the same age. (20%)
- 4. Selecting literature for ESL learners. Students select a piece of literature that would be appropriate for whole-person development in an ESL or integrated class and create a lesson plan. (35%)
