 - b) Students will learn how to compare the growth patterns in syntax of ESL learners with those of native speakers of English so they can determine if ESL learners are progressing normally for their age.
- 2. a) Students will learn the principles underlying the Counseling-Learning Approach to second language learning.
 - b) Students will practice using C-L classroom techniques which evoke both the emotional and the cognitive responses necessary for successful second language learning.

- 2. Creating a classroom task to assess an ESL learner's proficiency in writing (25%)
