EDUC 471-4 CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT: THEORY AND PRACTICE (E02.00)

PREREQUISITE: 60 credit hours.

Course Description:

This course examines how theory and practice interweave in currere, the process that is curriculum. Course readings offer a wide range of conceptual and methodological resources for thinking about curriculum development and practice. Employing a variety of theoretical perspectives including historical, political, postmodern, and relational curriculum discourses, we will examine how curriculum theory influences curriculum development and practice. Specific topics include: curriculum models, diversity, democracy, and imaginative education.

Expectations:

Students are expected to attend all classes, read all required materials, and complete course assignments on time. In addition, they are expected to develop a personal stance that illustrates that they have taken ownership of and engaged with course themes. Finally, students are expected to be active participants in class discussions and small group activities.
