Course Description:

This course examines the nature of curriculum in theory and in practice. Course readings offer a wide range of conceptual and methodological resources for thinking differently about curriculum and for deepening understanding of how curriculum theory influences curriculum development and practice.

Course Objectives:

1) To deepen understanding of the interaction between curriculum theory and practice.

2) To critically analyze a theoretical perspective and discuss its practical implications for curriculum design, teaching, and learning.

Students can expect to actively use the content from the required readings in the class for which they are assigned. How to best prepare readings for class discussion will be addressed in the first class.
