THIS COURSE:

- is offered to pre-service teachers interested in teaching a young clientele (4 to 8 years of age)
- * will assume/expect throughout, a <u>child-centred</u>, creative, individualized approach to the structuring of learning environments and experiences
- * will deal with Language Arts as a broad curriculum, involving the integration of different subject areas
- * will draw from no one particular text or program
- * may complement, but will not supplant, a developmental reading course (e.g., Education 473)
- * will be demanding.
