COURSE DESCRIPTION

Recent "patterns" of English and Language Arts curriculum design have attempted to mend the "broken English" approach of previous decades in which language acquisition and literary study were segmented into a number of seemingly discreet skills and topics, each of which was dealt with separately. This course will examine the threads that need to be re-woven into the fabric of a "whole language" curriculum and consider both the theory that mandates and the practice that accomplishes such a goal.
