COURSE DESCRIPTION

Education 472 is designed to provide teachers with a relevant theoretical base and the practical knowledge that is necessary in conducting an effective language arts program in the classroom.

Students will have the opportunity to examine the nature of language, how it is first acquired and what effects this has on teaching the elements of reading, writing, listening and speaking. Issues surrounding language arts instruction will be examined in order that the student will be able to make informed decisions as a teacher.

The course will consist of various activities: lectures, workshops, professional readings, individual writing tasks and collaborative group work. The student should leave the course with a collection of strategies and materials that will make language learning in the classroom more effective.
