DESCRIPTION

This course is designed for teachers and/or teachers in training who are interested in learning about the broad field of language, literacy and learning and its pedagogical application in elementary classrooms. Students will explore the principles and components of a balanced literacy program and their implementation in a rich and meaningful literacy-learning environment. Instruction will be organized around professional readings, small and large group discussions, demonstrations and task work. The instructor will employ a cooperative learning approach where participants are expected to be active, contributing participants.
