OBJECTIVES

The course will focus on developing knowledge, skills and strategies to create a rich and stimulating balanced reading program in the classroom. Issues in literacy learning, and reading in particular, will be examined through current theory and teaching practice. The framework provided will enable you to examine and reflect on your understandings about learning and the teaching of reading, and your role as teacher.

The course will comprise of a broad range of experiences. These will include professional readings, discussion and written response, seminars, demonstrations, individualized tasks and small-group work.
